Spring clean your home

Blow away winter cobwebs with a satisfying deep clean



Buy new supplies Stock up on cleaning essentials, as well as cloths and coloured gloves. Look for a pair with moisturiser built in for extra care, from £1.50 for a pair of multi-purpose gloves, Bizzybee.

invest in clever tools Treat yourself to Oxo Good Grips Deep Clean Brush Set, £5.99, Lakeland, to clean hard-to-reach areas. The large brush is for scrubbing grout, shower door tracks and cooker tops, while the smaller one tackles fixtures and has a rubber wiper blade at one end to remove dirt from plugs and other crevices.

KITCHEN REVAMP

Breathe new life into your kitchen with these fab ideas

PAINT WALLS Choose neutral shades for a calm feel or bright colours for greater impact. Use paints formulated for kitchens - they are tougher than regular matt paint and will withstand heat and moisture better.

REPLACE DOORS If your unit carcasses are in good condition, replace the doors. They come in standard sizes with pre-drilled holes, so it's an easy DIY job. Kitchen Door Workshop has a wide range of styles. Alternatively, spray your doors with Plasti-kote Twist & Spray paint, around £8 for 400ml.

CHANGE HANDLES Unscrew dated handles, measure the distance between the holes and buy new handles with holes the same distance apart for an easy swap. Or, fill the holes and choose a different design.

ADD A SPLASHBACK Remove an old splashback and replace it with a self-adhesive glass one for a hit of bold colour. A 60cm x 75cm glass splashback in a range of colours costs £135.29 at Topps Tiles.

Give garden essentials a facelift with a bold paint shade



Lay the planter down on top of a dust sheet. Stick a piece of masking tape diagonally on one side of the planter. Repeat on the next side, so the masking tape pieces join to a point at the top.



Dip a brush into
Hammerite Direct
To Rust paint, £9,99 for

Lime), and coat the area
below the masking tape.
Paint slightly over the
tape so coverage is solid.



When dry, add another coat if necessary, then remove the masking tape while the paint is still wet. Leave to dry fully. Plant the pot then position it in pride of place on your patio or decking area.

The TwinBrush features bristles for picking up dust and hair, which are easy to clean. It takes extra large self-sealing 4.5L bags too, allowing you to vacuum for longer. Using HEPA filtration, it'll also cut down on allergens. The vacuum cleaner also comes with a crevice nozzle and upholstery attachment.

Tester's verdict: "I tested the bagged version of this cleaner and, after cleaning two rooms, the amount of fur and dust I found in the bag was amazing! This vacuum really did give our floors a deep clean. The cleaner comes with a few different attachments, some of which are stowed inside the front of the cleaner, and the special pet attachment was fantastic! It's lightweight, packs neatly away and the filter seemed to not only get rid of the dust, but also left the rooms with a lovely fresh scent." Star rating: ***



The dualpurpose floor nozzle worked well when I switched floor surfaces and it really got into the corners. The pet turbo nozzle was extremely powerful, picking up pet hair effortlessly. HOW TO ... organise your bathroom cabinet

Start by clearing out the medicine cabinet. Check dates on any medication, take anything that has expired to your local pharmacy so they can dispose of it safely. Check bottles and tubes of lotions and ointments – if anything has separated, changed colour or hardened then get rid of these too.

Locate all of the half-used beauty products that have been forgotten about.

Discard anything that smells funny or has discoloured, separated or changed texture. Some products will have a symbol of an opened tub on the back with a number inside. This is the amount of months this product should be kept after opening. Generally products, especially facial skin care, shouldn't be kept for more than 12 months, and organic items even less.

Give the inside of the cupboard a clean before placing everything back.

Try to keep like products together, such as skin care or first aid, and place the taller items at the back so that you can see the shorter items at the front.

Re-stock any items that have expired or run out – cover most eventualities with painkillers, for adults and children, antihistamines, anti-diarrhoea tablets and indigestion treatments. In your first aid kit add: plasters, antiseptic, bandages and sterile dressings, medical tape, eyewash solution and a thermometer.

How can I remove chocolate from carpets and upholstery?

Technical expert from ServiceMaster Clean, Ian McCormack has

this advice: 'First scrape as much off as possible,

without pushing it

into the fabric. Make up a mix of 3 heaped teaspoons of biological washing powder to 1L of hand-hot water. Pre-test the mix in an inconspicuous area. Dab it on to the stain and leave it damp. The enzymes in the mixture will eat away at the chocolate until it's gone. This could take from one to eight hours. If all the chocolate has disappeared, take a clean white cloth, gently rinse the area with cold water, taking care not to over wet, and dab dry with another clean white cloth. Leave it to dry naturally. If the chocolate stain hasn't been removed repeat the above. If all attempts at removal have failed, call in the experts.
